The Adopt-A-Fire-Station Program

The Adopt-A-Fire-Station Program improves the working and living conditions for firefighters and paramedics for all 106 LAFD fire stations. Working in 24-hour shifts, stations are not only a workplace but also members' second home. Everyday household items like washers, dryers, ice machines, coffee makers, kitchen faucets, refrigerators, etc. are used around the clock. When one of these items breaks due to the heavy usage, a replacement is not covered by the city's budget.

How to Donate:

- Credit Card
 - On Our Website: www.supportlafd.org
 - Hover over the "Support" button
 - Click "Give"
 - Verify that the "Give: Adopt-A-Fire-Station" button is red
 - Input how much you wish to donate
 - Scroll down and click "Yes" under "Would you like to dedicate this donation?"
 - Input FS#, for ex: to donate to Fire Station 1, write FS1
 - Complete the rest of the form
 - Calling In:
 - Call (310) 552-4139
 - Inform staff that you would like to donate to a specific station
 - Staff will ask for your credit card information and charge it
- Check
 - Make check payable to "Los Angeles Fire Department Foundation" or the "LAFD Foundation"
 - Write in the memo the fire station you are donating to
 - Mail check to 1700 Stadium Way, Suite 100, Los Angeles, CA 90012
- Cash
 - You may mail or drop cash donations at the address listed in the header.
 - Include a letter or note stating it is dedicated to the station.
